

Reinforcement

High Need Schools

- Twelve (12) campuses out of 16 increased in their February benchmark Domain I overall from last year
- Majority of the campuses increased between 1-4 points
- Memorial HS met the minimum requirement in Domain I in February
- Launched two (2) schools of Innovation: Gardendale PK4SA Early Learning Program and Brentwood STEAM School of Innovation Two schools
- Three (3) innovation schools will launch in August 2020: Gus Garcia University, Perales Elementary, and Las Palmas



Refinement

High Need Schools

- Nine (9) schools will remain with an "F" rating
- Two (1) schools experienced a decrease in Domain I overall score from 2019, according to February benchmark data
- Only one (1) school met minimum score of 65 in Domain I overall score, according to February benchmark data



Superintendent Evaluation

High Need Schools

- 2020 District Accountability rating of 78 or a "C" (will remain)
- Twelve (12) campuses out of 16 increased in their February benchmark
 Domain I overall from last year
- Two (2) schools of Innovation: Gardendale PK4SA Early Learning Program and Brentwood STEAM School of Innovation
