


Missed School Days Waiver With No Make-Up Days February 15-19

 There are countless others that have continued to work hard for our students and staff, despite the many personal challenges that this weather has caused.











The National Weather Services issued a hazardous weather outlook affecting Bexar County based on the possibility of a hard freeze starting on February 12, 2021.

The Board has a substantial interest in protecting the health and safety of the District's students, staff, and community.


- Close campuses between February 15 19, 2021;

- Submit necessary waivers to TEA.







